Search for missing Malaysian plane continues...

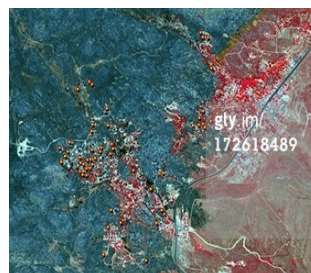
The Malaysian plane has been classed as missing since 01:30am on March 8th. Twenty five countries have been on the search for the plane (MH370) which had 229 passengers. The search continues to widen as there has been no sign of the missing plane. Signals were cut by the transponders being switched off. The Chinese government have found mysterious objects in the southern Indian Ocean.

The relatives of the passengers on the missing plane may believe that the Malaysian government are withholding information about the plane. There are many theories about what happened to the MH370 plane, including the possibility that it was hijacked.
